Congratulations, Will!

Will Vavra, Reno, Nevada, is a WAS member along with his mother, Karalyn and brother, Thomas. All three of them visited Albany, Oregon recently. Their trip was set up for one purpose: Will's commercial check ride.

Jack Loflin in his quest to become a Designated Pilot Examiner for balloons needed a check ride "guinea pig." Will jumped at the chance. Tihe timing was right. He had just graduated from high school, and his goal was to get his commercial certificate during summer break.

After finishing up his shift at work Saturday, the three family members headed to Albany very early Sunday morning. They arrived at Tim and Shari Gale's home about 45 minutes before Will was to meet Jack at the Albany Airport for his oral exam. Will passed that exam with flying colors. The next step was a check ride.

Now if the weather would just cooperate! It didn't. Monday was rainy. So they made lemonade from the lemons Mother Nature gave them. (If you know the name of the balloon Will was flying that weekend, you'll get the joke check out the photo captions if you don't.) Will, Thomas and Karalyn headed to Newport, Oregon. They visited the beach and the Oregon Coast Aquarium, and ate a lot of great seafood. On Tuesday it was still raining. That's not unexpected in Western Oregon in the spring. The boys played a lot of pool in the basement while Shari and Karalyn went thrift store shopping. While these activities were fun, it sure wasn't what they wanted to be doing. Will was checking the weather charts about every 15 minutes throughout the day. Wednesday was their last chance.

Luckily, for everyone involved, Wednesday morning's weather was good enough for a flight. Will launched from the parking lot at the Linn County Expo Center. Everyone had hoped the winds would be light enough that flight could be kept to a small geographic area. The 12 knot winds aloft dictated a change of plans. Will handled it well.

His final landing site was at the very edge of a grass seed field. He'd skimmed the across entire filed, landed on the edge, and had his crew walk him across the busy country road to a side street. (There were no

power lines on either road.)

The balloon got packed up, the paperwork was completed back at the launch site, and then everyone but Jack headed out to breakfast. Jack had a check ride to do in a multi-engine fixed wing in Salem. As soon as everyone else finished breakfast the Reno crowd headed home. They had an annual inspection in California the next day – on a different system, so they had to go home to Reno first. Then after a short breather they are off for several weeks to fly in Utah, Wisconsin and points in between.

Will did an excellent job on both his oral and check ride. He can now take time to reflect on his trip to Oregon.

Jack Loflin: Newest LTA DPE

The last time there was an active Designated Pilot Examiner in the Pacific Northwest was 2012. Since that time anyone wanting to get an LTA pilot certificate had to go to Utah, Southern California or wait until Kay West visited from South Dakota. In those cases, weather delays could be costly and/or could mean a significant delay in getting the check ride.

Those days happily have come to an end. Beginning at the end of June 2022 Jack Loflin, Albany, Oregon, is now a DPE for hot air balloons.

It is a delightful pleasure to introduce everyone to Jack Loflin, FAA LTA DPE.

Jack holds an Airline Transport Pilot certificate and is a certified instructor for airplanes, helicopters and balloons. He was already a DPE for fixed wing aircraft since 2017.

He works for Garmin in Salem. In his spare time he and his wife, Sallie, have been building their own home just east of Albany. When it is said he is building it, that's exactly what it means. He is not just supervising a lot of subcontractors. He is putting his own labor into the build, as is Sallie. It might be safe to say that their dog, Dublin, could be considered the primary on site supervisor.




Many of the balloons flew black banners.
